

Redistricting Summary

- State adopted the Federal census conducted in 2020.
- South Carolina Code Ann. Sec. 4-9-90 requires all County Council districts be reapportioned as to population by County Council within a reasonable time prior to the next scheduled general election.
- The next general election of County Council members is November of 2022.
- A person must live in the district that they will file for election.
- 7 members of County Council are to be elected.
- District 4 has 2 current County Council members that live in the same district.
- 1 new district will be created – District 6.
- Council member Passiment will change from District 6 to District 5, since he lives in the proposed district 5.

What criteria was used for redistricting?

- 1. County Council districts shall be of equal population, or as nearly practical, to comply and adhere to the Constitutional requirement of one person, one vote.
- 2. The population variance between County Council districts shall not exceed 5%. This is lower than the 10% required by S.C. Code Ann. Sec. 4-9-90.
- 3. County Council districts must comply with the Federal Voting Rights Act to ensure that minorities have an equal opportunity to elect representatives of their choice.
- 4. County Council districts must be contiguous.
- 5. County Council districts should be drawn to minimize the division of voting precincts, and, when feasible, with respect to existing districts and communities of interest.
- 6. County Council districts should be geographically compact to the extent practicable, so that nearby areas of population are not bypassed for a more distant population.
- 7. County Council districts must comply with all other applicable court decisions and Federal and State laws.
- 8. Public input should be solicited throughout the process.

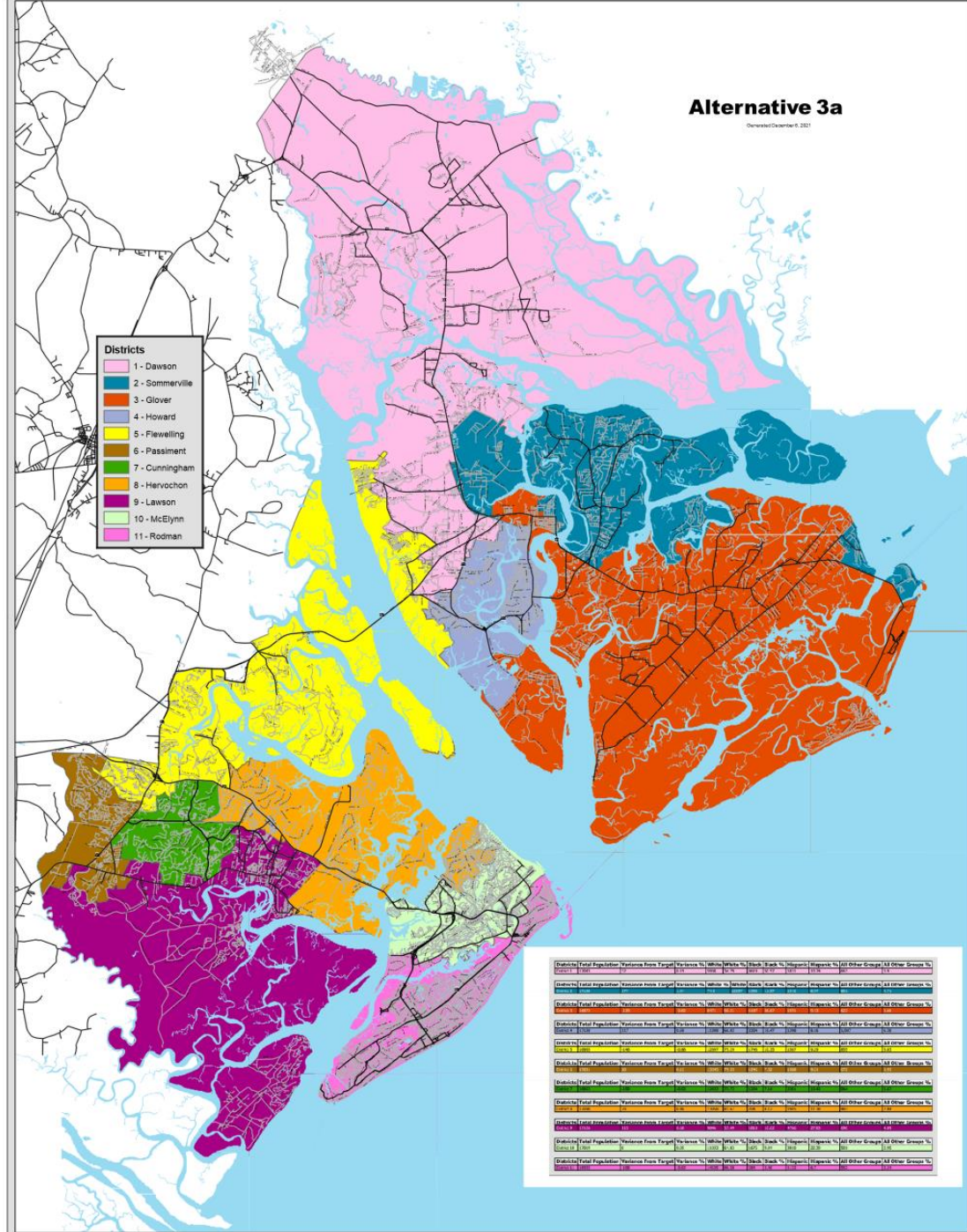

- County Council held three in-person meetings to get input from citizens of the county.
- November 29, 2020, USCB Beaufort Theatre 801 Carteret St, Beaufort, from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm. For Districts 1,2,3,4,5
- November 30, 2020, Bluffton Recreation Center Ulmer Road, Bluffton, from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm. For Districts 5,6,7,9
- December 1, 2020, at the Hilton Head Island Recreation Center, Wilborn Road, Hilton Head Island from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm. For Districts 8,10,11
- As a result of these meetings County Council made adjustments in the proposed districts.
- Three public meetings will be held by County Council to adopt the final district map.
- The meetings will be held on December 13, 2021, for 1st reading, January 10, 2022 for second reading and January 24, 2022, for the public hearing and 3rd reading for adoption.
